Financial Report

Our growth trend continues as assets increased to \$332,828,968 or a 6% increase over 2022. We also experienced a net growth in our loan portfolio, bringing our net loans outstanding to over \$277.3 million. Member shares grew to over \$293.8 million and we ended the year with a net gain to our undivided earnings of \$2,996,435. Our financial ratios continue to be strong, with our YTD Return on Assets at .93% and our Capital Ratio at 11.35%.

As you can see, our record of financial performance is something that you, as a member of Acadia FCU, should be proud of! Please remember that your credit union is a safe and sound place to conduct all your financial business and your deposits are insured to at least \$250,000 by the National Credit Union Share Insurance Fund.

2023 ENDING HUNGER CAMPAIGN: THIRD IN THE STATE!

Acadia teammates Craig, Alison, Jill, and Jennifer traveled to Freeport, ME on Feb. 13, 2024 to attend the Ending Hunger 2023 Results Luncheon, hosted by the Maine Credit Union League and Synergent, at Hilton Garden Inn | Freeport Downtown. At this luncheon, they learned that collectively, Maine credit unions raised an incredible \$1,221,868.94 in 2023 to help end hunger in Maine AND that Acadia FCU placed third in the state of Maine for total funds raised, with \$52,038.73!

We are so incredibly grateful for the support of credit union members and friends, the dedication of employees throughout all credit unions in the state, and for the administrative support from the Maine Credit Union League and Synergent.
