

President's Message SIGNING OFF WITH GRATITUDE

Dear fellow members,

As I reflect on the past year and prepare for what will be my final stretch with Acadia Federal Credit Union, I'm struck with a deep sense of pride and gratitude. This past February marked my 21st anniversary as President/CEO of Acadia—a milestone that brings with it many memories and an overwhelming appreciation for the journey we've taken together. I will retire from my position on July 1, 2025.

For those who may not be familiar with my story, my path with Acadia began on the volunteer side of the table. I proudly served on the Board of Directors for nine years when we were still known as Fort Kent Federal Credit Union. In February of 2004, I transitioned from volunteer to employee, stepping into the role of President/CEO with a clear directive to lead the credit union to success. At the time, that challenge felt daunting given the issues facing the organization. Looking back now, I can confidently say that not only did we meet that challenge—we surpassed it.



The numbers tell the story best. When I assumed the role of President in 2004, the credit union's total assets stood at just \$48 million. By March 2025, that number had grown to over \$386 million—an increase of more than 800%. Our loan portfolio expanded from \$33 million to over \$306 million, and member deposits rose from \$42 million to more than \$341 million. Membership itself has more than doubled, growing from approximately 6,800 to over 17,500 members. These are not just statistics—they are a reflection of the trust our members have placed in us and the hard work of a dedicated and talented team.

But our success has not only been measured by financial metrics. Over the past two decades, I've worked to elevate Acadia's profile both within the state and across the broader credit union landscape. I'm proud to have represented our organization as a Director for our corporate credit union, Tricorp FCU, and to remain closely connected with their leadership. I've also served for the past several years on the board of the Maine Credit Union League and its subsidiary, Synergent, recently having served as Board Chair. In addition, I've maintained strong partnerships with CU Insurance Solutions (formerly Insurance Trust), TruStage Insurance Company (formerly CUNA Mutual Group), and other key vendors and leaders in our industry. These relationships and affiliations have not only benefited Acadia, but they have also helped to ensure that we remain a respected and influential voice in the credit union movement.

As I look ahead, I am confident that Acadia is well positioned to continue its successful growth path. The foundation we've built together is strong, and the future is bright. Thank you for your continued trust and support. It has been the honor of a lifetime to serve as your President and CEO.

Financial Report

Our growth trend continued in 2024, with total assets reaching \$369,388,083—an 11% increase over 2023. We also saw net growth in our loan portfolio, bringing total net loans outstanding to over \$299.6 million. Member shares grew to more than \$326.4 million, and we closed the year with a net gain to our undivided earnings of \$3,642,447. Key financial ratios remain strong, with a year-to-date Return on Assets of 1.04% and a Capital Ratio of 11.22%.

These results reflect a record of financial strength and stability that you, as a member of Acadia FCU, can be proud of. Your credit union remains a safe and sound place to conduct all your financial business, with deposits insured to at least \$250,000 by the National Credit Union Share Insurance Fund.


